## Scheduling Process

- How are you doing?

  - 22 credits required for graduation

## Course Requirements

- Take the most **challenging courses** you can manage successfully.
- **4 year Colleges**
  - **Math and Science:** Should take 1 each year
    - Science: Bio, Chem. & Physics
    - Math: up through Finite/Trigonometry
  - **English:** Should take 1 credit each year minimum
  - **Social Studies:** Should take 3 credits (Wld. Cult., Cit. Ed., US Hist. & 1 elec.)
  - **International Language:** Should take 3 consecutive years of the same language

## NH State Scholars Initiative

- Courses must include:
  - ❖ **English** - 4 years including Essentials of English, 3.0 credits English Electives (ask counselor for complete list) ;
  - ❖ **Math** - 3 years, to include Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II or higher;
  - ❖ **Laboratory Science** - 3 years of basic Laboratory Science, to include Biology, Chemistry, and Physics/AP Physics/Adv. Chemistry/Anatomy & Physiology;
  - ❖ **Social Studies** - 3.5 years, (chosen from U.S., World Cultures, Economics, and Citizen Education, 0.5 Social Studies Elective; and
  - ❖ **Foreign Language** - 2 years of the same foreign language in high school other than English.
